
#### 7. Health

## ■ Life Expectancy at Birth

Life expectancy at birth for men and women had lengthened almost every year and reached over 70 in 1960 for women and in 1971 for men, respectively. In 2015, life expectancy at birth was 87.05 years for women and 80.79 for men.



## Proportion of Elderly Population by Sex


As life expectancy for women is generally longer than that for men, the share of women is larger than that of men among the elderly population. Hence as population ages, the share of women in the population becomes larger.





The transition of main indices for items related to maternal and child health from 1975 to 2015 reveals that, as a whole, every index has been on the decline.




### Number of Abortion by Age Bracket



#### Number of HIV-Infected Patients

The number of HIV-infected patients including AIDS patients newly reported in 2015 was 1,434 (1,546 in the previous year,) and the accumulated total (excluding cases caused by blood products) reached over 25,000. The number of HIV-infected patients without AIDS newly reported in 2015 was 948 men and 58 women and as for patients with AIDS, 409 men and 19 women.



The largest share of newly reported cases of HIV-infected patients without AIDS involved young people in their 20s (270 men and 7 women) and 30s (277 men and 14 women.) As for patients with AIDS, age distribution is shifted 10-year older than HIV-infected patients without AIDS.
