
7. Perceptions of Gender Equality

Sense of Equality in terms of the Status of Men and Women


With regard to the status of men and women throughout the entire society, 74.2% of respondents considered that "men are being given preferential treatment."

Stereotyped Perception for Gender Roles ("Husband is expected to work outside the home, while wife is expected to take on domestic duties")

In the 1979 survey, more than 70% of respondents supported the perception of gender roles. In the 2004 survey, respondents opposed to the perception outnumbered those who agreed to it (48.9% and 45.2%, respectively) for the first time. The number of opposing outnumbered those who agreed in the 2016 survey, but a breakdown by gender shows there are differences in perception between men and women.
