Under the strong leadership of the Cabinet, the Japanese government has been taking gender equality measures by enhancing the national machinery, such as appointing the Minister for Gender Equality in 1992 as well as establishing the Council for Gender Equality and the Gender Equality Bureau within the Cabinet Office in 2001.

As for contribution to the international community, the Japanese government revised its ODA Charter in 2003. The basic policies of the revised ODA Charter place a priority on the perspective of gender equality as an important issue that should be taken into consideration at every phase of Japan's ODA, from policy formation to implementation. Moreover, the Japanese government newly established "Initiative on GAD (Gender and Development)", that clearly defines basic approaches at above mentioned phase, such as enhancing gender analysis and encouraging women's active participation. By implementing ODA projects based on these policies, Japan intends to contribute further to gender mainstreaming in the world.

In the Ten-Year Review and Appraisal Meeting, Japan will actively contribute to ensure the success of this meeting by providing knowledge and experiences obtained from actions undertaken, such as reinforcement of national machinery. Paying due attention to new perspectives raised during the Ten-Year Review and Appraisal Meeting, Japan will further promote policies and measures in order to achieve gender equality both within and outside our nation.
